The rich side is graced with the nice table cloth while the poor side has a carved up table with initials from different characters carved in the table. The center of the table are two candlesticks representing those from *Les Misérables*, and a bell representing the Hunchback. To connect the two sides is red fabric representing the blood from the French revolution. The piece also comes with a menu talking about the author and specific characters from both books.
